- Center follows the school calendar
- Has a rapid response team to assist with facilities needing short term support (classroom management, behavioral issues, 1:1 support or classroom wide support offered
- Looking for space in the downtown Butler area for programming

- 3-month program 4 days a week. Classes held at YWCA
- Next session starts September 30
